HOW TO ACCESS YOUR PUBLIC RECORDS

What is a Public Record?

Public record means all documents, papers, letters, maps, books, tapes, photographs, films, sound recordings, data processing software or other material, regardless of the physical form, characteristics, or means of transmission, made or received pursuant to law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business by the City.

Who Can Request Public Records?

Florida'a Public Records Law requires that City records shall be open for personal inspection by ANY person.

Requests for public records can be made in writing, but they can also be made verbally, whether in person or by telephone. Public records requests sufficient to identify the records sought must be honored regardless of how the request is made.

Persons requesting public records are not required to disclose their name, address, telephone number or other identifying information, unless the City is required by law to obtain this information prior to releasing the records.

The City charges \$.15 for paper copies up to 8-1/2 inches plus an additional \$.05 for a two-sided copy.

Requests for Information vs. Requests for Records

Florida's Public Records Law requires the City to provide access to public records; it does not require that the City provide information from their records.

PSTA BUS SHELTER PROJECTS

The City recently completed the installation of two new bus shelters located at 109 and 813 Gulf Boulevard.

These shelters were 100% funded by IRB Action 2000, Inc.

CITY HALL PROJECT

On Tuesday, February 14, the City welcomed the public to an Open House for the newly renovated Library, Civic Auditorium and Public Services Administrative offices.

SOLID WASTE OPERATIONS RELOCATION

The City recently completed the relocation of the Solid Waste Operations to the new facility in Largo with operations commencing on Monday, February 20. The former site, at 201 Miami Avenue,

will be the location for the new IRB Community Center.

STORMWATER DRAINAGE PROJECTS

This project currently is in the design phase with the intent to institute stormwater management techniques such as run-off mitigation, attenuation and filtration, as well as provide the opportunity to update the stormwater discharge from the area (454 20th Avenue and 2038 20th Avenue Parkway) to current environmental standards.

This project is part of the City's 2017 Capital Improvement Budget and is also cooperatively funded through a reimbursable grant from the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFMWD) in the amount of \$134,395.

2017 IRB STREET REHABILITATION CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

This project is approximately 50% complete at this writing; the project location is 1st Street, from 16th Avenue to 22nd Avenue; project completion is tentatively scheduled for the end of May.

KNOW YOUR FLOOD HAZARD

Take advantage of these free city services. Call City Hall at (727) 517-0404 today to find out:

- ♦ In which flood zone your property is located;
- ♦ If your property is subject to special flood-related hazards, such as coastal erosion;
- ♦ If your property is located in an area that has previously had flooding problems;
- ♦ If your property is located near an area that should be protected because of its natural floodplain functions;
- ♦ If an Elevation Certificate is on file for your building;

Call the Indian Rocks Beach Building Department, at (727) 517-0404, for information on what would be an appropriate flood protection level for your property. The Staff can discuss property protection measures and/or review existing problems and make a site visit.

Pinellas County flood warnings are broadcast by local television stations including PCC-TV (Bright House 622, WOW! 18, Verizon 44) and local radio stations, as well as by the National Weather Service NO-AA Weather Radio and The Weather Channel. Tune in to these media stations for instructions during times of possible flooding or storms. Listen for weather updates, evacuation orders and expected storm arrival times. The City of Indian Rocks Beach is in Evacuation Zone A.

Sign up for *Alert Pinellas*, a free emergency notification service at www.pinellascounty.org/AlertPinellas, or call (866) 484-3264 if you do not have internet access.

Be aware of these personal safety steps:

- √ Heed warnings from officials evacuate when orders are given;
- √ Well before an evacuation order is issued, know your hurricane evacuation zone, know your evacuation routes, and plan where you will go;
- √ Be especially cautious at night during flooding, being aware of downed power lines and electrical wires;
- √ Have battery-operated flashlights and radios in working condition and have extra batteries:
- √ Do not drive or walk into flooded areas.
